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Definitions

Register of Systems	A register of all systems or contexts in which personal data is processed by the Business.

1. Data protection principles

The Business is committed to processing data in accordance with its responsibilities under the GDPR.

Article 5 of the GDPR requires that personal data shall be:

- a. processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to individuals;
- b. collected for specified, explicit and legitimate purposes and not further processed in a manner that is incompatible with those purposes; further processing for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes shall not be considered to be incompatible with the initial purposes;
- c. adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary in relation to the purposes for which they are processed;
- d. accurate and, where necessary, kept up to date; every reasonable step must be taken to ensure that personal data that are inaccurate, having regard to the purposes for which they are processed, are erased or rectified without delay;
- e. kept in a form which permits identification of data subjects for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which the personal data are processed; personal data may be stored for longer periods insofar as the personal data will be processed solely for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes subject to implementation of the appropriate technical and Business measures required by the GDPR in order to safeguard the rights and freedoms of individuals; and
- f. processed in a manner that ensures appropriate security of the personal data, including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing and against accidental loss, destruction or damage, using appropriate technical or Business measures."

2. General provisions

- a. This policy applies to all personal data processed by the Business.
- b. The Responsible Person shall take responsibility for the Business's ongoing compliance with this policy.
- c. This policy shall be reviewed at least annually.
- d. The Business shall register with the Information Commissioner's Office as a Business that processes personal data.

3. Lawful, fair and transparent processing

- a. To ensure its processing of data is lawful, fair and transparent, the Business shall maintain a Register of Systems.
- b. The Register of Systems shall be reviewed at least annually.
- c. Individuals have the right to access their personal data and any such requests made to the Business shall be dealt with in a timely manner.

4. Lawful purposes

- a. The lawful basis of consent is selected for all data processed by the Business.
- b. The Business notes the appropriate lawful basis in the Register of Systems.
- c. Evidence of opt-in consent is retained with personal data.
- d. Any individual may revoke consent and request their information be removed at any time.

5. Data minimisation

- a. The Business ensures that personal data is adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary in relation to the purposes for which they are processed.
- b. If the Business ceases to trade then all personal date will be permanently deleted.

6. Accuracy

- a. The Business shall take reasonable steps to ensure personal data is accurate.
- b. Where necessary for the lawful basis on which data is processed, steps shall be put in place to ensure that personal data is kept up to date.

7. Archiving / removal

- a. To ensure that personal data is kept for no longer than necessary, the Business shall put in place an archiving policy for each area in which personal data is processed and review this process annually.
- b. The archiving policy shall consider what data should/must be retained, for how long, and why.

8. Security

a. The Business shall ensure that personal data is stored securely using modern software that is kept-

up-to-date.

- b. Access to personal data shall be limited to personnel who need access and appropriate security should be in place to avoid unauthorised sharing of information.
- c. When personal data is deleted this should be done safely such that the data is irrecoverable.
- d. Appropriate back-up and disaster recovery solutions shall be in place.

9. Breach

In the event of a breach of security leading to the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorised disclosure of, or access to, personal data, the Business shall promptly assess the risk to people's rights and freedoms and if appropriate report this breach to the ICO (more information on the ICO website).
